

## **Keeping Chickens**

Residents in the District council of Loxton Waikerie area are permitted to keep chickens provided they follow the below guidelines:

- 1. A floor area of 0.37 square metres is required for <u>each</u> bird. For example, a coop for 12 laying hens needs to be a minimum of 2.4 metres by 1.8 metres wide
- 2. Council approval is required for coops more than 15 square metres
- The coop must be placed at least 1 metre away from all boundary fences to allow access for cleaning
- 4. Food and straw must be kept in vermin roof receptacles
- 5. Waste should be cleared up and disposed of weekly in cooler months and more frequently during warmer months
- 6. For better ventilation and to help keep the floor dry, face the open front of the coop in an easterly or southerly direction

## **Roosters and Other Poultry**

Roosters and other poultry can create noise from an early age, so no resident should consider owning these types of animals within a suburban environment.

Complaints made about roosters and other poultry which create noise may result in the animal/s being removed.

## When does Council get involved?

Council addresses complaints based on nuisance if chickens are causing unreasonable noise, dust, odour, or there are more chickens or other poultry than acceptable.
